Incommunicable Attributes of God – God's Independence

Introduction

The attributes (or character) of God can be grouped broadly into two categories:

- *Incommunicable attributes*: those attributes that God does not share with us Eq. independence, immutability, eternity, omnipresence and unity
- **Communicable attributes:** those attributes that God does share with us Eq. love, mercy, justice...

God's Independence

- 1. Can you think of an example of someone you know who is "independent" and someone who is not? What distinguishes them?
 - Eg. Adult vs. child; wealthy vs. poor
 - not reliant on others for physical / material / social needs...
 - may be independent in certain dimensions while dependent in others no completely independent human
- 2. What do the following passages teach us about the independence of God?
 - Acts 17:24-25 (cf Job 41:11), Psalm 50:7-15
 - independence wrt MATERIAL / PHYSICAL needs
 - Acts 17 / Job 41 God does not need anything from us / we cannot give to God anything that did not come from Him; everything belongs to God
 - cf with other "gods" eg. Greek gods who needed humans to provide for them
 - Ps 50:7-15 in teaching what sacrifices are acceptable to God (thankfulness, obedience), God reminds His people that worship was not ordained out of God's *need*; v.15 – in contrast, we need God
 - John 1:1,14; 17:1-5, 24
 - why did God create mankind? Was it because he was lonely?
 - independence wrt RELATIONAL needs
 - love and perfect communion existed between God the Father & God the Son before creation
 - Rev 4:11 (cf. Rom 11:33-36); Psalm 90:2
 - independence wrt His EXISTENCE
 - Rev 4:11, Rom 11:36 all things were created by God; in contrast, all things are dependent on Him
 - Ps 90:2 God existed (and is God) before creation and for eternity ie. God was not created
- 3. If God does not need anything from us (since He is independent), what is the significance of our existence? (see Isaiah 43:5-7 (cf Eph 1:11-12); Isa 62:3-5)
 - Isa 43:7 we are created / called to glorify God
 - Eph 1:11-12 chosen / predestined "for the praise of His glory"
 - Isa 62:3-5 we are able to bring Him joy and delight
 - it is an act of God's love and grace to allow us to have relationship with Him
 - we are meaningful b/c God has created us and He has determined that we would be meaningful to Him
- 4. If God was not fully independent, what would be the implications of this on our faith?

In summary...

God <u>does not need</u> us or the rest of creation for <u>anything</u>, yet we and the rest of creation can <u>glorify Him</u> and <u>bring Him joy</u>.
