A. The Existence and Knowability of God

- 1. According to scripture, how do we know that God exists? Rom 1:18-25
 - External Witness: evidence in nature a clear declaration (Ps. 19:1-4)
 - Internal Witness: Humanities "inner sense" of God
 - the position of scripture (Gen 1:1)

In their wickedness, mankind actively denies God's existence and Satan blinds an unbeliever of this truth (2 Cor 4:3-4). In CONTRAST, a believer can have an intimate awareness of their heavenly Father and Christ dwells in our hearts.


2. How can we come to know God?

- not by our own (worldly) wisdom, rather through God's personal revelation (1 Cor 2:14, Rom 1:19)
- through Christ alone with the help of the Holy Spirit (John 14:6, 16-17)

We can never fully understand Him as his ways are *unsearchable, beyond measure,* and *higher than our ways* (Ps 145:3, 147:5, Isaiah 55:9)... YET, it should be our ambition to be "increasing in the knowledge of God" (Col 1:10)

B. Incommunicable Attributes of God

- 1. God's INDEPENDENCE Acts 17:24-25, Isaiah 43:5-7
 - God does not need us or the rest of creation for anything, yet we and the rest of creation can glorify Him and bring Him joy
 - Incl: material / physical needs, relational needs , His existence
- 2. God's **IMMUTABILITY** Exodus 3:13-15, Mal 3:6-7, Psalm 33:11, Num 23:19
 - God is unchanging in His being, perfections, purposes and promises, yet God does act and feel emotions, and He acts and feels differently in response to different situations
- 3. God's **ETERNITY** Psalm 90:2,4
 - God has no beginning, end, or succession of moments in His own being, and He sees all time equally vividly, yet God sees event in time and acts in time.



- 4. God's **OMNIPRESENCE** Jer 23:23-24, Psalm 139:7-10
 - God does not have size or spatial dimensions and is present at every point of space with His whole being, yet God acts differently in different places.
 - Present to: punish, sustain, and bless (Amos 9:1-4, Isaiah 43:1-5, Col 1:17, Ps 16:11)
